In all the world, there are things we do to care for each other. God's gift is the complicated one of relationships. From the beginning in Genesis, everything is connected. Each moment, each person, each plant and animal in the world needs something to live to work to give purpose. Sometimes they are a clean place on dirty ground to sit and prepare a meal. Often times they are put above the heads of those in the hot sun to provide some shade. These blankets are not keepsakes never to be touched, but loved items that provide a better, softer life for someone in a tough time. Often they are sent to those in refugee camps that walked away from everything they own to find safety. Other times they are given to those whose home and belongings are destroyed in fire or flood. The blankets made here by the hands of many become a relationship with someone across the world. As we celebrate and bless the quilts on September 20, we honor the makers of the quilts and pray for those who will receive them. Through this world we do the holy work of creating relationship with God's people, even if we never meet.

Kitchen remodel & Fundraiser Update

- A gift of \$10,000 was recently received from a member who is no longer able to attend Grace. This generous gift helped cover an \$8,000 plumbing bill.
- Salad Luncheon proceeds of \$1,995 were donated to the Kitchen Fundraiser.
- Fundraising is nearing completion and is anticipated to be resolved by the end of the calendar year.
 - Marsha Smith will provide final numbers by week-end, as the Grace Foundation is interested in the results of the fundraiser and may consider making a gift toward any remaining need.
- Cabinetmaker Steve Schulz is still working on a few final details for the kitchen, including items like trim and cabinet slide-outs.

Report: Deacon Jessie

- Youth Trip to Duluth
 - The trip went very well. Cleo Moller shared that her favorite part was seeing Lake Superior upon arrival, which she felt connected her to God.
 - All Youth enjoyed spending time with both familiar and new people, including staff and helpers they met at the service sites.
 - The High Ropes Course (an elevated obstacle course, including Zipline) was a highlight for many. Participants wear safety harnesses and move across suspended bridges and platforms.
 - The youth did a great job with their Adult Forum presentation on Aug. 2, receiving many compliments regarding their trip summary and photos shared. While on the trip, the Youth decided on the topics and highlights for the Forum themselves.
- National Youth Gathering
 - In Minneapolis, June 28-July 2, 2027
 - Registration window opens in late October
 - Youth and parents: stay tuned for details regarding meetings and fundraisers
- Accessibility Ramp
 - Discussion has been held regarding building or acquiring a movable ramp, approx. 24' long, that could be used to access the stage in the Fellowship Hall or provide access over the stairs in the Sanctuary.
 - The goal is to make these areas more accessible for people using wheelchairs or walkers, including access to the stage, educational spaces, and improving access to Communion at the rail.

\$500,000 Stewardship

- Sub-committee met 7/23/26.
 - Present: Jerry Dahl (Volunteer committee lead), Steve Bracker (Building & Grounds representative), Ginny Loberg (Mission Team representative), Dave Drommerhausen (Financial representative), Jennifer Zoller (Youth & Family representative), Deacon Jessie Camp (ad hoc), Pastor Shane Koepke (ad hoc)
- Objective
 - Discuss and prepare to present a proposal to Council regarding the use of \$500,000 in gift funds.
 - Our goal is to thoughtfully and faithfully steward this generous gift and create a lasting legacy for our church through investments in ministry, community, facilities, fellowship, and future generations.
- Proposed Allocation
 - Entirety of funds are currently invested in an account, earning interest.
 - **Mission Team: \$50,000 (10%)**
 - The Mission Team will determine how these funds are used.
 - Church Council may also make recommendations to the Mission Team.
 - To be spent/utilized within five years.
 - **\$450,000 Remaining Funds**
 - To date, we have identified the following as possible uses for the funds. Timelines to be determined.
 - Repair outside steps, south entrance
 - Accessibility & safety
 - Estimated cost: \$50,000
 - Repair sidewalk, build ramp, west entrance (Garfield Ave.)
 - Accessibility & safety
 - Cost: TBD
 - Improve ramp inside kitchen (basement) entrance
 - Accessibility & safety
 - Cost: TBD

New Business

- Replace/repair steeple lights
 - Restoration & property enhancement.
 - Estimated cost: \$6,000
- Replace narthex lights
 - Hospitality & functionality.
 - Estimated cost: \$20,000
- Fire pit improvements, southeast lawn
 - Fellowship, youth, & hospitality.
 - Cost: TBD
- Grace Lutheran Church Memorial Scholarship
 - Education & legacy.
 - Initial amount TBD
- Suggested Council Discussion/Next Steps
 - Affirm the 10% (\$50,000) Mission allocation and allow the Mission Team to determine its use, with Council and the Mission Team able to make recommendations to one another.
 - Determine the desired allocation of the remaining funds, as listed above.
 - Prioritize the identified projects, beginning with accessibility and safety.
 - Obtain firm estimates/bids for projects where costs have not yet been established.

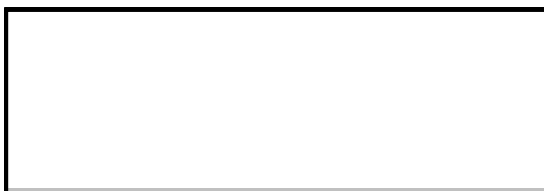
