Have you ever heard someone quote the Bible with the following statement: "Money is the root of all evil"? I have heard it and I think I've even used it once or twice. Unfortunately, we have been using it that way for years, but if you go to the Bible, you will read it has a bit of a different version. The true words are "The love of money is a root of all kinds of evil..."

The difference here is who to blame. Our misheard version blames money: "Money is the root of all evil." Therefore, we don't have to take responsibility for the actions of money. The Bible, however, makes it clear that the love of money is the problem, not the money itself. It's our love of it. In fact, the verse continues by saying that our "...eagerness to be rich" causes us to "wander away from the faith and pierce us with many pains." That, friends is a different way of looking at our bank accounts, pay stubs and offering plates.

Money is complicated. Someone always has more, someone always has less, and we are here watching it all while we have our own balance sheets. We are asked for generosity from every direction. Church asks, non-profits ask, the kids and grandkids always have a fundraiser here and there for the band or sports team. On top of that are the non-negotiable of taxes and fees for the privilege of living in our city, county, state and nation. I'm not saying they aren't valuable things to use our money for, but they can often get blinded by the need to have it stay in our own hands.

This last month Dolly Parton died, and with her, a lifetime of not only entertainment as a singer, but also her deep commitment to generosity. In her younger days she would wear expensive diamonds and jewelry. Often people would compliment them and she would take them off right there and hand them over. Her support team learned quickly to switch her real diamonds out for rhinestones! On top of that she started a theme park that brought the area of her hometown out of poverty.

She started a reading program that sends children books from birth to age 5. Dolly could have simply used her money to make more money. She could have fallen in love with money in such a way that it became self-serving and evil. But, she didn't. She chose to use her wealth to help others in ways we are learning about more and more in the days since her death. Dolly wasn't perfect, neither are you or I. Do you know who Dolly would thank time and again for the opportunity to help others: God.

She claimed God as the one who encouraged her to be open and welcoming, to be humble and generous. She created systems that brought others out of poverty because she herself knew that money doesn't buy happiness but it can be used to do some real good in the world.

Grace has been generously gifted \$500,000. The council was set with the task on how to spend that money per the request of the donor who wants to remain anonymous. The council put together a task force of members representing all the aspects of Grace: youth and family, buildings, older adults and missions team. This team formed and prayed and made suggestions to how that money could be spent. 10% goes to the Missions Team to spend within the next 5 years. The remaining amount will go to help with capital repairs (building upkeep) with a couple of tasks already started. Grace has and remains a place for people to gather and become disciples for Christ together. We continue to think about how to spend the generosity given by you and others to do just that.

Later this month, we will have the opportunity to witness six of our young people publicly profess their faith and affirm their baptisms. After worship, they will share projects they've completed that illustrate their faith journey, and we will join in celebrating their fantastic accomplishment.

Each year, as we watch students affirm their baptismal promises, it serves as a reminder of confirmation and its purpose. Unlike baptism and communion, the rite of confirmation isn't something that Christ mandated that we do. Confirmation isn't a requirement to receive the sacraments, nor is it a requirement for membership or participation in the congregation. So, the question stands, why would we bother to do it?

For one, confirmation is a long-standing tradition of the church. Many of you may remember your own confirmations: perhaps you, too, wore a white robe, memorized a bunch of scripture and liturgy, and chose a confirmation verse that you hold dear. As such, confirmation has also become an integral part of many congregations' faith formation practices. It is a really great opportunity for us to talk about the Bible in a more in-depth way, as well as learn about Martin Luther, the Catechism, and the Lutheran Confessions. In addition, it's often a great opportunity for students to be inquisitive about the faith and its role in their lives.

The Lutheran Church also has a tradition of baptizing folks as infants. And at our baptisms, promises were made on our behalf: to live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's Supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth. Since many of us were unable to make these promises when we were baptized, the rite of confirmation is our opportunity to affirm those promises and profess our faith in front of the assembly.

It's important to note that confirmation is not a "completion" of our baptism, either. Our baptisms are a one-and-done thing. The Holy Spirit entered into us on the day of our baptism, and at confirmation, we ask the Holy Spirit to be stirred up in each one of our confirmands. We say, "Stir up in them the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever."

As we celebrate our confirmands, I invite you to pray for them as they embark on a new step in their faith journey. I also invite you to reflect on our own faith journey: how do you understand and fulfill your baptismal promises? How has the gift of the Holy Spirit impacted your life?
